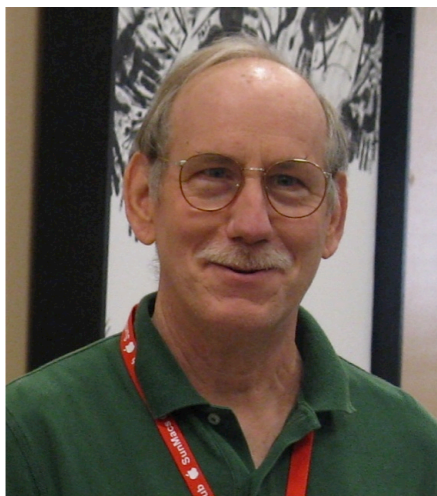

Tech Talk ***By Isaac***

Printers

The holidays brought many of our members' new Apple products. A common question is: What type of new printer should I buy? A simple question, but not a simple answer.

There are 2 types of printers, multifunction and single use.

Multifunction printers can scan, copy, and print. For most of our members, a multifunction printer is all that's needed. There are 4 main manufacturers, Cannon, HP, Epson and Brother. Good quality printers start around \$100.00 and go up from there.

Printers come in 2 main types, Inkjet and Laser.

Inkjet printers use a print head to “spray” a liquid ink on to the paper. Inkjet can print in color and black & white. Inkjet printers can produce photo quality print. Initial cost can start at \$75.00 (less if on sale). One drawback of the inkjet printer is the cost to replace the ink cartridge. New cartridges can range from \$18.00 for a B&W to

\$35.00 for a 3-color cartridge.

Laser printers use static electricity to attach powdered ink to the paper (toner). Laser printers can print in color and black & white. Initial cost for black & white can start at \$100.00, more for a color model. For members who have no need for color printing, a multifunction Laser B&W printer would be a good choice. The initial cost for laser printers is higher than inkjet printers. However, replacing the toner cartridge doesn't need to be changed as often. The price per print is lower than ink jet printers.

The answer should become clear depending on what you are going to print and how much.

Members who plan on printing a lot of color photos, multifunction inkjet will produce superior photos then laser. For our users that have the need to print color photos and general printing, the multifunction inkjet printer is a good choice.

What about Laser Printers?

Color multifunction Laser printers are a good choice for members that do

lot of printing. Initial cost for a color laser is higher but cost per page is much lower than an inkjet printer.

Black & white multifunction laser printers are the best choice for our members who do not need to print in color. Initial cost is about the same as an inkjet printer but cost per page is much lower.

I hope choosing a printer is a little clearer. I haven't mentioned single use printers that can only print, no scan or copy functions. This type of printer tends to be more basic so the initial cost is lower. Printing cost is the same as inject/laser multifunction printers. These printers can be used as a second printer to supplement the main multifunction printer. A single use photo printer can be used to print high quality photos allowing the main printer to be a B&W laser printer with lower printing cost. A single use B&W laser printer is perfect to be left behind by our winter residents as the toner ink will not dry out.

When Is It Time To Upgrade Or Replace My Apple Device? – part 2

Last month I gave 3 reasons why you may be ready to replace your device instead of upgrading or repairing it. Today, I'm going to give 3 more examples and give you some ideas to keep your equipment running as long as possible.

4. You keep running out of storage space. This is tougher on iOS devices because you typically cannot upgrade storage space. On those devices you would need to create a plan to manage the storage by offloading documents, photos, videos, or apps to the cloud. On a Mac, you can add an external hard drive to expand capacity relatively cheaply.
5. This one is more focused on the Mac. If you constantly see the spinning Beach Ball. This indicates there is a problem with



a resource on your computer that is slowing it down. This is not typically an issue with the speed of your internet but is more an indication of an issue on your computer. There are ways to investigate why this is happening and I would suggest you ask at the Mac Club their thoughts. Try to know what programs you have running when this occurs.

6. The last thought with regard to the topic of why you might want to replace your device. You like having the “latest and greatest”. One of the perks of being in the Apple universe, is when you upgrade to a new device your old one has residual value that can be applied to the cost of your new Apple. The newer your device that you are turning in, the higher value it will still have, typically. You don't have to turn it into Apple. There are other companies that will give you an offer for your old equipment including Gazelle.com, OWC.com, and locally at MacMedia.

So in summary, should you replace or upgrade? That will depend upon your situation but you have many in our club that know how to fix many issues you may encounter with your equipment. We also watch for news regarding known issues, recalls, new product announcements to be able to help our members best understand what their options are.

Come join us in the club room for good discussions regarding many ways you can use your Apple devices and for help when they stop performing as they should.

Ever wish your iPhone apps were organized? Here is how to move your apps to find your favorites quickly and easily.

1. Select and press down firmly on the app you wish to move.
2. Tap Edit Home Screen (the apps will begin to jiggle.)
3. Drag and drop the app where you want it.
4. To move it from one screen to another, drag it to either the right or left edge until the screen you want appears, then release it.¹

February 2022 Class Descriptions. (RT = Round Table)

Board Meeting: The Board Members meet at this time.

Canva: Canva is an application for your Apple devices that allows you to easily and quickly create professional graphic documents. Starting from a variety of templates you can create flyers, newsletters, cards, headers for social sites, and many other items. This class will introduce you to Canva and we will create a couple documents. Canva is Free on the App Store and does offer a subscription fee for access to all options.

Connecting computer to TV: going through the connecting process to see things larger.

Creating & Using Macros in Microsoft Excel:

Excel is the standard for spreadsheets. You can create, manage, and analyze data using Excel. Excel allows you to automate simple to complex tasks using macros. In this class, we will review what a macro is, how they are created, and how to use them. This is an intermediate

level class meaning you should have a basic understanding of Excel as we will be using various functions and formats to create the macros. Excel is offered from Microsoft. We will be using Office 365, which is subscription-based.

Genealogy SIG/RT: Discussions will focus on helping one another solve brick walls. Each month the SIG will focus on topic of interest for genealogists.

Genealogy 101 Step 3: a follow up to begin to explore Genealogy and learn the basics & tools for exploring and hunting for information

Getting to Know YouTube RT: an opportunity to know more about using YouTube.

iPad/iPhone RT: come with your device &/or your questions and desires to learn.

iPhone Photography: an RT to discuss and share ideas and info about photography on the iPhone.

🍏 Laptop Basics: This 4 session class purpose: (1) To learn the basic functions of the

Macintosh computer using OSX; (2) To provide hands on experiences to practice these functions; and (3) To promote a desire to learn more about the many features of the Mac computer. Also, to help those who are transitioning from a PC to a Mac.

New Member Orientation & Monitor Training:
